## What Motivates our Work?

#### A Letter from the Director

I have often been asked over the last 10 years about what motivates our community development work in our beloved Rio Grande District. Let me tell you what motivates our work: the need is great.



- Education: 46% of adults have not completed high school, 77% of children are considered to be at-risk of not completing high school
- **Income:** The median *household* income is \$16,630/year, 24% of households earn under \$10,000/ year
- Housing: 78% of residents are renters, 58% live in rental units with only one bedroom or no bedroom
- Transportation: 35% have no access to a vehicle, there is no major grocery store within walking distance
- Family: 82% of children are born to unmarried women, births to teenage moms is more than double the national average, 67% of young children live below poverty

At Ciudad Nueva we envision an alternate future than what the statistics depict. We want to interrupt cycles that ensnare in poverty and despair. We aspire to cultivate hope and an environment where kids, families and the community are empowered to move toward a successful future where these statistics are no longer a reality.

We do what we do at Ciudad Nueva because our faith invites us, even compels us, to care for our neighbors, especially when the need is great. In the beginning we started walking alongside just 10 third graders. Ten years later we are working with hundreds of neighbors as we empower youth, support families, build community and equip leaders.


After ten years of relationships and investment, I am humbled and inspired by the individuals who are already creating this alternate future for themselves, their families and their community. I am inspired by: students who have excelled in school and earned academic scholarships to college, youth who have grown deep in their faith and now disciple students younger than themselves, parents who work hard to learn English and acquire relevant work skills, residents coming together to advocate for improvements in the neighborhood, and a mosaic of church denominations working alongside each other with a profound care for the wellbeing of their church neighbors. I am humbled and inspired to witness a glimpse of the kingdom of heaven in our central El Paso community.

As I dream about the next ten years I am excited to see even more of this alternate future unfold. Soon Ciudad Nueva will need to move out of our current location. We are looking to restore the historic St. George's church into a multi-service community development center -- a center that would enable us to multiply our impact — with initiatives such as job training and micro-enterprise development, a community performance venue, or formalized internships for neighborhood college students, or... maybe all of these and more.

Thank you for your relationships, for your investments and for dreaming with us as we reimagine the future for the Rio Grande District!



## 2013 Programs II Empowering Youth

#### **Empowering youth for a successful future**

Ciudad Nueva youth programs provide a setting where students can find friends, mentors and a place to call home. These programs are built on a holistic framework aimed at nurturing kids physically, mentally, socially, emotionally and spiritually. In 2013 Ciudad Nueva provided over 20 hours/week of structured after-school programs aimed at developing students in all of these areas. Kids are connected to mentors and adult leaders who serve as models and support the kids in achieving their full potential.

#### **Elementary School** • Launch Pad

Program meets twice each week after school and included:

- Matching each child with an adult mentor for a long term friendship
- Snack
- Study time
- Rotating activities arranged around a semester theme (such as integrity or love) including:
  - Spiritual growth and life skills lessons (e.g. dealing with conflict)
  - Climbing wall training, art activities + open recreation
  - Money management skills, youth bank + store

#### Middle School · Kids Create

Program meets three times each week after school and included:

- Snack
- · Study time
- · Daily activities:
  - Tuesdays selection of short courses in areas such computer repair, sewing, auto mechanics, photography, art, dance, piano, and chess
  - Wednesdays Wyldlife youth club music, crazy games, relationships and a message or life skills lesson
  - Thursdays open recreation games, sports, hanging out, relationships, youth store
- Boys soccer and girls volleyball options after program



## 2013 Programs II Empowering Youth

#### **High School**

Program met in the evenings during the week and included:

- · Young Life Club (Mon. nights) music, crazy games, relationships and a message or life skills lesson
- Campaigners (Tues. nights) for those wishing to explore deeper issues + spiritual truths
- Sun City Wolves boys soccer team practiced and played weekly league games, consistently placing in the top 3 teams in the league. Go Wolves!
- Sun City Wolves summer and fall **soccer tournaments** organized up to 16 7x7 soccer teams in seasonal tournaments
- · College prep, financial aid assistance, job readiness assistance and job referrals


## **Empowering our community through neighborhood initiatives**

Three border fellows joined us in 2013 for our 10-month leadership development opportunity aimed at providing


experience and training for young adults to:

### Mobilizing, Training and Connecting

Multiplying leaders with a heart for developing under-resourced neighborhoods

- Ciudad Nueva (in partnership with La Frontera) led two graduate seminary classes for Border Fellows - and other interested parties - addressing issues of faith, poverty, culture, youth, community development, ethics and contemporary border issues. Students developed a Sunday school series on *Poverty, the Gospel, and Me*
- Ciudad Nueva leaders shared about bridge-building and community development work at seminars, workshops and churches in El Paso, Juarez, Waco, Chicago and New Orleans.
- Led the way in collaborating to form El Paso chapter of the Christian Community
   Development Association -- hosted 2 citywide events and a 1-day in depth Christian community development training for invested local leaders
- Indigenous leadership development Three new El Paso staff (one from our neighborhood) joined the CN team to intentionally re-invest in the transformation of the Rio Grande District
- Bethany Molinar (Ciudad Nueva staff) coordinated the No Need Among You conference of the Texas Christian Community Development Network in Waco, TX




