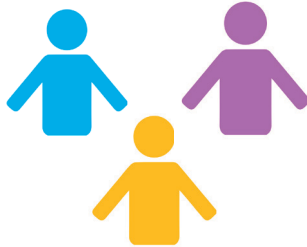


EMPOWERING YOUTH

Empowering youth through holistic after-school programs

160 students

in grades 3-12 participating in program, accessing mentoring, tutoring, creative arts classes and more



5,573 meals

served to students during after-school programs

25 hours

of after-school programs provided every week



63 students

went to summer camp in 4 states and experienced horse back riding, rock climbing and white water rafting



97 youth

participated in UPWARD SOCCER

35 graduates

from El Paso High School who participated in Ciudad Nueva Youth Programs. *96% of students who have participated in CN youth programs graduate high school vs. 83.9% EPISD graduation rate



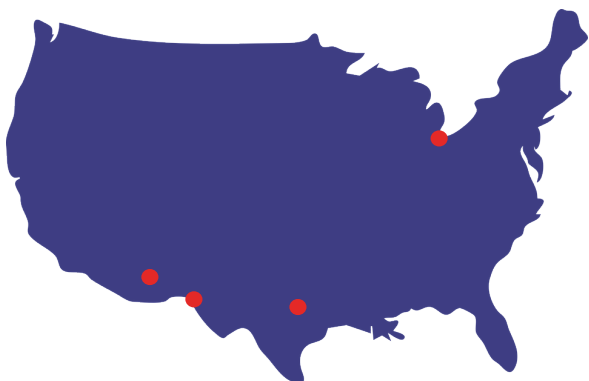
8 Catalyst
